are blossoming in their various areas of responsibilities. Carla Dickinson oversees our programming team as well as coordinates our discipleship programs. Our partnership with Reality Church is flourishing and we continue to have dozens of community members attending church, hosting as many as 30 people for lunch afterwards at The House. Ange Wu is thriving in her new role as Boundless Coordinator with 20 youth enrolled. Our Boundless participants are receiving a growing level of support and many are graduating from high school. Gillian Tiessen has also adjusted well to her role as a House Parent. We have temporarily reduced our capacity for full-time housing, but she has been kept busy supporting our newest resident and hosting community guests. 65 different community members visited The House in September and 61 in October. Both months, over 100 meals were served to visitors. Sarah Hartung passionately oversees our volunteer department. She recruits and screens all new volunteers as well as supports over 40 volunteers who give their time in various capacities. Sarah also provides on-the-ground support in The House and coordinates birthdays celebrations for our core youth. Kitty Chan and I are working hard to provide the developmental and administrative support necessary for a growing ministry, while I also continue to house parent at The House.

The year of 2013 has been a year of growing in depth. By adding a



THE BIG FOUR AT INNER HOPE



Inner Hope may look messy at times, but in reality, everything we do is categorized into four focus areas: housing, discipleship, life skills, and support. When a youth gets plugged into the Inner Hope community, we provide support for them in as many of these areas as possible according to their needs. Be encouraged as you read stories about the impact on the lives of our youth with the help of your support!



"The House" is located in the East Vancouver area, and is a substance free home for youth who desire structure, support and accountability in their lives.

At the beginning of September, Inner Hope helped Selena enroll in school and shortly after that, Selena moved into The House. Prior to Inner Hope, she had spent a lot of time on the streets and rarely attended school. Since moving in, her life has changed in many ways. She has been attending school regularly and is doing well in all her courses! She has also dedicated hours of her free time to her new hobby-making duct tape wallets! Selena is looking forward to the weeks ahead where she will be busy making and selling these wallets as the Christmas season approaches. At The House, we are excited to see Selena continue making positive choices and



working towards living a healthy life!

Though The House is a home to some youth, it is a second home to many more as a place of love and belonging. Many young adults, teens and children attend Reality Church on Sunday mornings and are welcomed back to The House for a meal and afternoon of community and conversation after the gathering. This past October, 25 different individuals attended church and we hosted an average of 19 people for sunday lunches!

Our life skills programs include post-secondary educational support and Boundless, a one-onone mentoring program that is also responsible for "FUNshops," monthly workshops that focuses on exploring and learning important life skills.



Cassidy was introduced to Inner Hope this past summer by one of our existing Boundless youth. Since then, she has shown tremendous growth. With the support of her mentor, Sarah, Cassidy has improved her time management and communication skills, as well as taken and passed her learner's driver test! In the short time of her involvement, her and her parents have seen significant change in her attitude and motivations. Through Inner Hope, Cassidy has gotten connected in many other areas of the community including Camp Qwanoes (where she began her relationship with Jesus!) and Reality Church Vancouver, where she recently started to bring her family to!



Inner Hope is a community that provides round-the-clock support. This includes: celebrations (birthdays, graduations, holidays), practical support (meals, laundry, mailing address), advocacy (court hearings, meetings), and visits (hospital, jail, treatment facilities).

Frankie is a young man who has recieved significant support over the years. "I joined Inner Hope for one reason only: to get free food. My intention in the beginning was to just take what they had to offer, but I didn't know that they also offered a way to meet Jesus. Since I've joined Inner Hope I can confidently say that I've started to do life differently. From making my bed to the way I talk to others, it is all a product of me joining Inner Hope. It has made a 100% difference in my life as it was not headed in the right direction. Once I met the staff, I realized that instead of blaming others I should take



responsibility for my actions. I am now staff at a Discipleship Training School in Oliver, BC with the YWAM base, learning and growing in ways I never thought possible. I know that without their modelling I wouldn't be where I am today and I thank God for all the staff and all the people that contribute to Inner Hope. All because I wanted free food." Inner Hope continues to support Frankie through regular phone calls and occasional visits as we walk with him on his journey to adulthood.
