The Grads of 2023

On June 27th, we celebrated our grads with a Blanket Ceremony led by John Johnstone, who is Stó:lō from Leg'a:mel First Nation. Blanketing is the highest honour given in Coast Salish communities - and it is well deserved for our graduates!

Statistically, an average of 49% of Indigenous students in Vancouver graduate within five years and 63% within 6 years, compared to 84% of their peers (Aboriginal Report 2019/20 - School District 39). Many of our parents didn't graduate with their peers so it's really touching for them to see their children achieve this milestone.

The words of affirmation that their parents shared at the Blanketing Ceremony were powerful. One mother shared that her mother was a residential school survivor and seeing her son graduate brought her hope.

Future Priorities for 2023 to 2027 What Incredible Provision! Current Needs

We have just approved our next 5-year plan. There are four key areas that have risen as the greatest needs for focused time and resources. The goals below will take time to implement, as good changes are rarely accomplished quickly.

1. Increase Indigenous Representation & Cultural Integration

- Currently our community is around 85% Indigenous and we all desire to have more staff and volunteers from the community.
- We plan to increase Indigenous representation on the board, among staff and volunteers.

2. Strengthen Inner Hope Youth Ministries' Volunteer Department

 Volunteers are critical to many programs and services at Inner Hope – especially the Boundless program where each youth is matched one-on-one with a mentor.



 We plan to grow our recruitment strategies and increase volunteer support, strengthening the volunteer community (the last plan had a strong focus on staff support).

3. Increase Community Support

- In order to better address the impacts of intergenerational trauma, there is a need to increase support for parents and alumni and expand our capacity for crisis support.
- We plan to develop a new Community Support position within the next few years as finances allow.

4. Restructure and Contextualize the Discipleship Program

- We believe that God made all cultures to uniquely reflect His image. We are not made the same and we do not see and experience life and faith through the same lens.
- We plan to restructure and contextualize the Discipleship



Program with guidance from Indigenous leaders.

An overarching goal that weaves through all of our programs is to address four chosen calls from the Truth and Reconciliation reports' 94 Calls to Action.

In order to address the intergenerational impacts of colonization and residential schools, we commit to:

- Helping strengthen families in order to reduce the number of Indigenous children and youth in foster care,
- Helping increase educational attainment of Indigenous, students to reduce poverty rates
- Helping youth build a supportive community and healthy coping strategies to reduce the number of Indigenous people in the corrections system, and
- Helping churches learn the history and legacy of residential schools to prevent future spiritual violence.



We continue to be amazed by our large community of financial supporters and the ways the ongoing needs of Inner Hope Youth Ministries continue to be met. The last couple of years we received a lot of designated support for special projects like moving costs and renovations for our new home as well as a new van that was purchased last month.

The move and the new vehicle were critical needs beyond our control. The van we had used for the last 10 years had developed a growing number of serious mechanical problems and was no longer safe to take on trips outside the city. Again, we are incredibly grateful for the generosity of all of you who have and continue to invest in Inner Hope.

Now, our greatest need is for donations towards our operating expenses. In January – May we had an operating deficit of approximately \$70,000. In order to meet our current needs and also have the funds necessary to begin to work on our new strategic plan, we need to refocus on our operating budget and supporting the Inner Hope community through the vital programs and services we offer.
