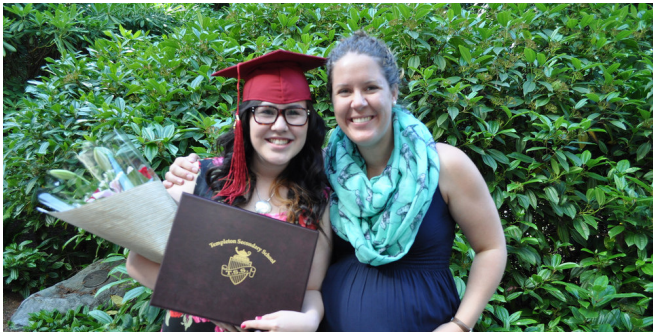


World Vision Partners with Inner Hope to launch Post-Secondary Program

We are excited to partner with World Vision's Canadian Programs for the second time to launch a Post Secondary program. Over the last six months, Inner Hope staff have conducted a community assessment including interviews and consultation groups. Results show **an urgent need for support services for at-risk young adults leaving the safety net of the high school environment and/or the care of the social service system, where the majority of supports end at age 19.** We desire to build on the relationships we have developed with teens through Boundless and other Inner Hope programs to help more of our young people successfully transition into adulthood. **Our post-secondary program will focus on the creation of an individualized education/employment plan - a 5-year plan broken down into six month steps.** We are very thankful for the support of Marshall Gallardo, World Vision's Regional Program Manager for Metro-Vancouver, who has provided ongoing leadership and support throughout this process. Our pilot phase (5-week trial run) started in February and the official program launches April 1. Marco Sotres has become our Post-Secondary Coordinator and

Recently, **Bakerview Church** initiated a partnership with **Reality Church** and **Inner Hope** for their **50th Anniversary Project**. Over the last two years, growing interest in church attendance among Inner Hope youth and children led Inner Hope to begin a full Sunday ministry, driving youth and children to church services at Reality and hosting lunch and afternoon activities afterwards at The House (Inner Hope's community space). A rotating team of cooks and over a dozen Sunday volunteers, invest in the lives of children and youth on

Sunday afternoons. In addition to contributing towards Inner Hope's discipleship costs, Bakerview also assisted Reality with renovating the Sunday School space in an old church building they recently acquired, in order to better facilitate ministry for the children who come through their doors. Darrell Rempel, a Bakerview member, stepped up when he heard of the need for a playground behind the church. His company, Captain Concrete, provided the work to create the surface for the playground. We are excited to partner together with Reality and Bakerview Churches and anticipate the transforming work of Jesus in many young lives. ▲

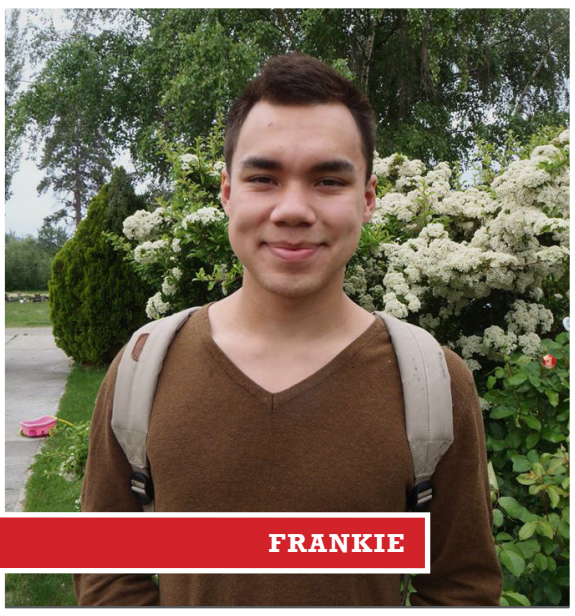

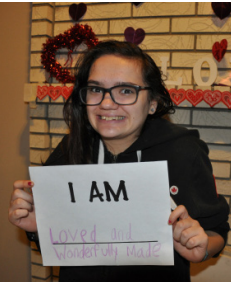
Girls Valentines Night

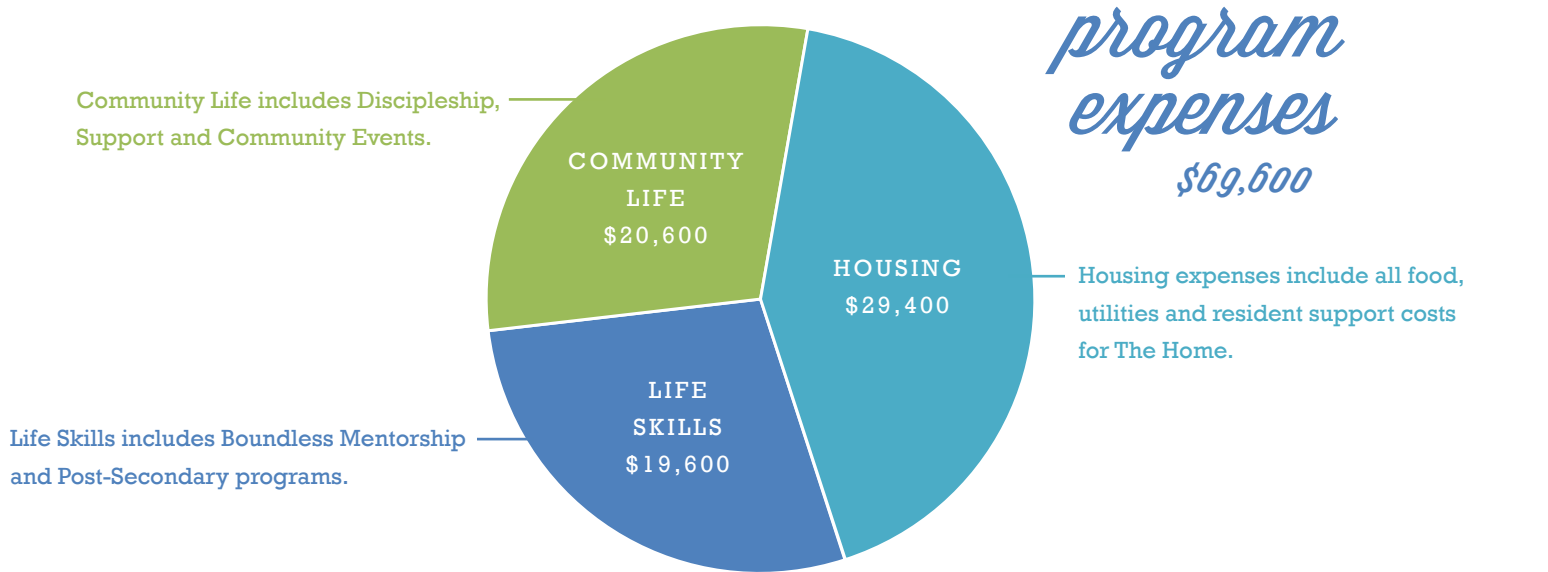
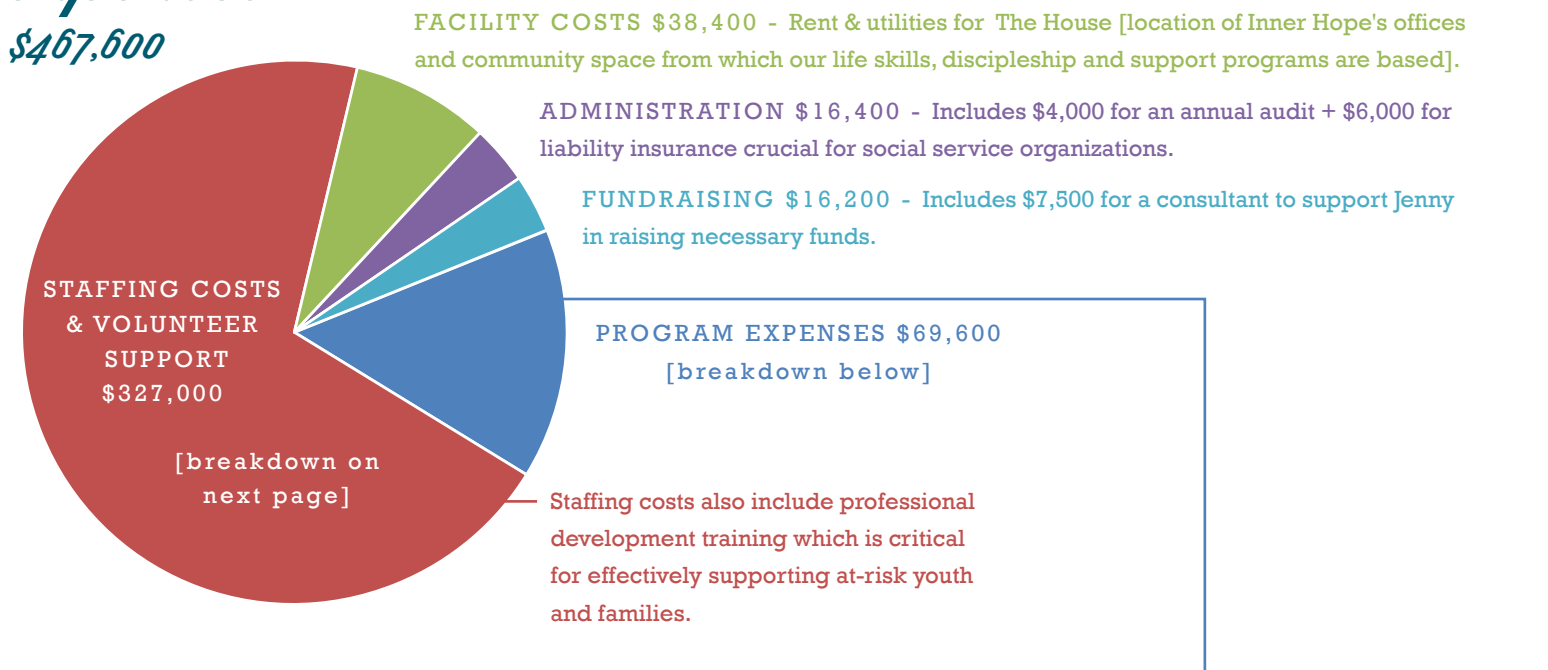
2015 Financial Picture

Your Partnership Matters

Through God's leading and provision through the gift of your partnership, in 2014 Inner Hope served 244 individuals: 108 youth, 53 children and 74 adults! Together we provided housing to 10 young people, mentored 47 individuals in life skills, hosted 75 different people for Sunday lunch after church and provided support, advocacy and crisis intervention to dozens of others. We are so thankful for your generosity and partnership in the work of young lives being transformed in Vancouver. In order to sustain our expansion to two sites and the accompanying staff and programming expenses, our operating budget for 2015 is \$467,600. With your valued partnership we anticipate an income of \$497,800 with a goal to ensure a contingency fund for the upcoming year. In this newsletter we hope to provide a clear financial picture to increase awareness of our financial needs and demonstrate how your money is stretched for maximum impact.

Inner Hope's staff and contract wages support the full-time equivalent of 7.5 positions and reflect the reality of living in one of the most expensive cities in Canada.



Most positions are part-time, with staff having significant impact in limited hours. In less than a half-time position, our Volunteer Coordinator facilitates the involvement of 90+ volunteers. Over 100 individuals are supported annually through programs and events facilitated by our Community Life Coordinator. Our Administration & Communications Assistant is responsible for our website, newsletters, promotional materials, thank you cards, data entry and purchase of office supplies in a less than half-time position.

Our housing ministry requires the highest level of staffing at 2.25 full-time equivalent (2 House Parents plus 1 Home Respite Contract). The home also requires 24-7 care and is staffed at a significantly lower level than most public group homes.
